

We had a great parish "mini-assembly" last Sunday. Around 36 people, including around 8 young members of our parish, gathered to share their joys and hopes for Holy Cross Parish. I was

excited by everyone's enthusiasm. After Easter, we will pick up on the challenges for us that emerged from our conversation. In the meantime, please continue asking in prayer for the Holy Spirit to lead us together in the right and good way.



Holy Week and especially the Triduum of Easter (the Three Days of Easter) are the holiest days of our Catholic calendar.

Holy Week begins next Sunday with Palm Sunday. We gather

outside the church holding small branches and process into the Church, recalling Jesus entering into Jerusalem to the acclamation of the people. The Gospel reading will then turn our minds to his Passion (suffering and death). This year, we hear the Gospel according to St Mark.

The Triduum is one Liturgy in three/four parts. On Holy Thursday evening, we celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper. It is the last Eucharist we celebrate before Easter. Following Mass, we will have a time of adoration and finish with Night Prayer of the Church. On Good Friday the Liturgy continues with the Passion of the Lord. This is not Mass. The church will be bare. We gather to hear the Scriptures including the Passion according to St John. We venerate the Cross and pray for the world at this time. The Blessed Sacrament from Holy Thursday will be distributed in Holy Communion. On Holy Saturday evening marks the beginning of the new Easter. The vigil begins with the new fire and the Easter Proclamation of the Resurrection of Jesus in the light of the new Paschal Candle. We then listen to the story of the covenant as told through the Scriptures. Following the vigil we celebrate the Mass of the Resurrection.

On Easter Sunday morning begins the new Easter Day. From this new Easter day, we proclaim to the world that Christ is risen, indeed!

Put these days in your calendar and make every effort to celebrate the Triduum.
